Interpreting the 'Tank Man' symbol

Talking points

- 1. Pat Bagley's cartoon shows a Republican elephant blocking a column of "health care reform" emergency vehicles. The cartoon is a takeoff on Jeff Widener's iconic 1989 photograph of a lone Chinese man confronting a column of tanks in Beijing's Tiananmen Square. Outside of China, the image of the "Tank Man" has become a compelling symbol of individual heroism. Use the Internet to do some research about the image and the impact the incident has had on history.
- 2. Is the cartoonist saying that the defiant Republicans are heroes for stopping the reforms? Or is he contending that they are simply blocking progress? Explain your view.
- 3. Is there anything in the cartoon that might indicate what the cartoonist's opinion really is about the stonewalling?
