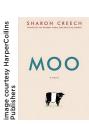
There's no better time to curl up with a good book than over winter break! Put a book From the Sky" by Benedikt or two on your gift list and get lost in a story.

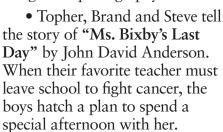

by Dan Yaccarino celebrates the art and the power of storytelling. The book traces all the ways human beings have shared stories throughout our history.

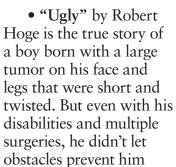


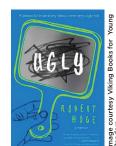

Cook's Corner

Acorn Squasharama

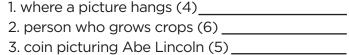
You'll need:

- 1 medium acorn squash
- 1 tablespoon butter, plus 1 teaspoon
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon honey

- 1. Cut the acorn squash in half. Scoop out all the seeds.
- 2. Place the two halves in 1/4 inch of water in a glass baking dish. Make sure the cut portion is facing down in the water. 3. Cover with plastic wrap. Microwave on high for 12 to 15 minutes.
- 4. Allow to cool slightly, then scoop cooked squash out of the rind and into a bowl.
- 5. Mix in butter, brown sugar and honey until blended well.
- 6. Divide into 4 servings.
