The annual NIE Teacher of the Year award recognizes educators who advocate for literacy and civic learning through innovative classroom use of the Tampa Bay Times and NIE resources. Our 2022 winners were recognized at a virtual award presentation on Thursday, April 21, 2022.

2022 Grand Prize Winner



The 2022 NIE Teacher of the Year is **Linda Cox**. Linda teaches art at Bay Crest and Morgan Woods Elementary Schools in Hillsborough County.

Linda was chosen as NIE Teacher of the Year for her ongoing use of the Tampa Bay Times to promote literacy, civic awareness and character development through art. Linda has used the Times as a classroom resource since 2015.




NIE has won two prestigious **World** Young Reader Prizes from the World Association of Newspapers and News Publishers.

NIE publications win national awards

Three educational publications produced by the Tampa Bay Times Newspaper in Education program received awards in the 2022 National Newspaper Association Better Newspaper Editorial Contest in the Newspaper in Education Partnerships category.



Pathways to Understanding was awarded First Place. This publication was produced in partnership with Community Tampa Bay, the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation and the Doris Duke Foundation for Islamic Art. It presents an overview of Muslim culture, busts some myths about Islam and Muslims, and explores the causes and consequences of Islamophobia, prejudice and discrimination.



Reduce Your Use: The Dos and Don'ts of Recycling in Hillsborough County 2019 was awarded Second Place. This bilingual publication, produced in partnership with Hillsborough County, focused on helping students and community members understand the environmental impact of single-use plastics, waste reduction, and reducing, reusing and recycling.



<u>NEA Big Read: The Things They Carried</u> was awarded Third Place. This publication was produced in partnership with the Hillsborough County Public Library Cooperative as part of the National Endowment for the Arts' Big Read program. It focused on Tim O'Brien's 1990 novel *The Things They Carried*, considered one of the nation's most important books about the experience of war.

Winners were recognized at an awards ceremony held Saturday, October 2, 2021, during the NNAF's 135th Annual Convention & Trade Show in Jacksonville, Fla.

2022 Science Fiction and Fantasy Writing Award

The Tampa Bay Times Newspaper in Education Science Fiction and Fantasy Writing Award is an annual writing contest for Tampa Bay area high school students.

The award seeks to nurture and recognize the creativity and talent of young writers in the Tampa Bay area. It was established to encourage aspiring authors to explore the genres of science fiction and fantasy and to experiment with the short story format.

The theme of the 2021-2022 contest was "Fantastic Florida." This year's judges included Tampa Bay Times book critic Colette Bancroft, 2021 winner of the Mystery Writers of America's Robert L. Fish Award; Parallax Award-winning author, editor and musician Tenea D. Johnson; and Sidewise Award-winning writer, editor and educator Rick Wilber.
