

Cook's Corner **Cheesy Egg Wraps With Ham**

You'll need:

- 4 fajita-size flour tortillas
- 1/2 cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 8 thin slices smoked or baked ham (such as deli-style ham; about 4 ounces)
- Cooking spray
- 4 large eggs
- 1/4 teaspoon salt • 1/4 teaspoon pepper


What to do:

- 1. Arrange tortillas on a flat surface. Top each with 2 tablespoons cheese and 2 slices ham. Spread the filling to within 1/2 inch of the edges.
- 2. Coat a large skillet with cooking spray and preheat over medium-high. Whisk together eggs, salt and pepper; add mixture to hot pan. Cook without stirring until bottom is set, 1 to 2 minutes. Flip the eggs and cook for 20 more seconds or until cooked through.
- 3. Divide egg "pancake" into four equal pieces. Place each piece on a prepared tortilla

Eco Note

Global heating is on track to become so intense during the next few decades that 60% of cactus species may be threatened, a new study finds. Researchers from the University of Arizona examined data from more than 400 species and projected how the warming climate would affect them. "Our results suggest that climate change will become a primary driver of cactus extinction risk, with 60% to 90% of species assessed negatively impacted," the researchers concluded.
