- ❖ **What?** – Real News in Schools is a partnership with the North of Boston Media Group partners and local businesses to provide free digital access of our newspaper to anyone within the school to encourage students’ awareness and critical thinking through absorbing local news. It also includes curriculum resources for teachers.
- ❖ **Where?** – Within your classrooms and throughout your entire school, on any devices connected to your schools network.
- ❖ **When?** - As soon as we have your commitment to have your school join our “Real News in Schools” program, we will go to work to find a local business willing to sponsor your school. Once a sponsorship is secured, we will contact you about setting it up.
- ❖ **Why?** – Because local, trusted journalism matters now more than ever. Teachers can incorporate the “Real News in Schools” program into their current curriculums inside the classroom,
- ❖ **How the Program works** – There is no cost to your school. When a sponsorship is secured, we will work with your IT Department to obtain your school’s IP address, enable it on our end, and you will have access to the daily newspaper.
