
2023-2024 year-end teacher survey

Classroom use of the digital edition continues to rise, but a solid contingent of teachers still use print newspapers.


- > 27% of NIE teachers received only print newspapers in 2023-2024, up slightly from 24% in 2022-2023.
- > 37% of NIE teachers received only digital licenses in 2023-2024, up from 29% in 2022-2023.
- > 36% of NIE teachers requested both print newspapers and digital licenses in 2023-2024, down from 47% in 2022-2023.



More than half of NIE teachers encouraged or required use of the newspaper outside of the classroom in 2023-2024.

- > 32% of NIE teachers gave their students print newspapers to take home at the end of the day.
- > 17% of NIE teachers encouraged their students to read the digital edition at home.
- 5% of NIE teachers assigned the digital edition for homework.






- I assigned the e-Edition for homework

95% of NIE teachers reported that classroom newspapers enhanced their instruction in 2023-2024.

66% of NIE teachers said classroom newspapers improved student knowledge of/engagement with community issues and news.

- "Improved students' critical thinking skills about current events."
- "Helped students realize the curriculum we were studying had real life implications."

60% of NIE teachers said classroom newspapers improved student interest in learning.

"My students enjoyed seeking out information which pertained to themselves (weather, sports, etc.)."





52 percent of NIE teachers said classroom newspapers improved student reading skills and comprehension.

"Helped students to develop better writing processes by using the published articles as model exemplars."


47 percent of NIE teachers said classroom newspapers improved student classroom engagement.

26 percent of NIE teachers said classroom newspapers improved student subject matter knowledge.

"Used with my Economics and U.S. Government & Politics students. Very relevant to those classes."
