Kaylin teaches science at Oak Park Elementary School in Hillsborough County.


Kaylin was chosen as a 2024 Runner-Up for integrating the newspaper into her science curriculum.

Kaylin uses the newspaper weekly to keep up to date on any current events in the community or developments in science that reflect what students have learned in the classroom in the real world.

In addition, the newspaper is an important component of two major annual projects: the fall STEM Fair and a spring poster project.

The STEM Fair project runs for four weeks between Thanksgiving and Winter Break. Students work on creating their own experiment to help a group in the community, shelter animals, or the environment. Students utilize the newspaper to come up with topics and ideas relevant to the surrounding community. Once students have chosen a topic, they utilize the newspaper as one of their resources during the research portion of their project. After the STEM Fair, students create community outreach projects based on their STEM Fair topic and experiments.

In the spring semester, students participate in a research poster project. They use the Times and
