We are constantly studying different topics - from technology, to the economy, to literature and historical events. What better way to keep my students in tune with the realities of life and writing than with the Tampa Bay Times!"

This assignment not only lets students stay up-to-date with current events, but it also allows them to access information from sources other than social media.

Most importantly, it gives them the chance to take control of their learning. Although they start with a set rubric, but they have the freedom to make a decision on where to start for their monthly essay.
