Bias, Prejudice, Steretypes

Bias

Prejudice in favor of or against one thing, person, or group compared with another, usually in a way to be considered to be unfair. May be explicit or implicit.

Prejudice

Preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience.

Stereotype

A widely held but fixed and oversimplified image or idea of a particular type of person or thing.

"The other thing you have to understand was that the message crept into our national consciousness very slowly. It did not happen all at once. We did not wake up one morning to hear it pouring out of the radio at full strength. It started with a sneering comment, the casual use of the term "cockroach," the almost humorous suggestion that Tutsis should be airmailed back to Ethiopia.
